8.0 Other Business

COMP and CCPM Joint Code of Ethics and complaints process

While independent organizations, CCPM and COMP maintain a close relationship; Medical physicists certified by the CCPM must also maintain membership with COMP. In 1997, COMP developed a Code of Ethics with input from both organizations.

A refreshed Joint Code of Ethics was approved in 2022 by both Boards.

To date, complaints have been dealt with on an ad hoc basis in the absence of a joint formal adjudication process.

Proposed bylaw amendments were presented to the members. This included:

- Align with new COMP and CCPM Joint Code of Ethics and complaints process
- Address some minor inconsistencies:
 - Member definition
- Follow best practice to not reference specific sections of the Canada NFP Corporation Act

RESOLUTION 2024-06-07-05

IT WAS RESOLVED that revisions to the bylaws of the Canadian College of Physicists in Medicine be approved.

8.0 General Discussion

Question requesting clarification on residency completion?

Currently, residency completion is set for March 31 of the year in which the exam is taken. Starting in 2025, this will change to the first Friday in December to align with application deadlines. Proof of completion will need to be submitted with the application. It may be worth revisiting this change, as some centers use these deadlines as hiring benchmarks and may require more time to adjust.

For recertification credits, if a graduate student attends a joint 4th year graduate course in medical physics, it qualifies. If graduate student didn't attend, the same work no longer qualifies. May want to consider this scenario in undergraduate courses as well. While it's not possible to list every potential option, it's reasonable to submit the work completed and provide an explanation.

What is CCPM doing to address workforce shortages and support internationally trained medical physicists looking to work in Canada through bridging programs?

Currently, the bridging program is the only option to support internationally trained medical physicists. Hospitals must sponsor the candidates, and the program must be offered through an accredited institution. Efforts are underway to connect smaller centers with larger ones (e.g., Moncton with McGill). However, candidates must find work independently, as the college cannot issue invitations. Each province has its own criteria for who can work in its hospitals.

Forming a task force focused on identifying and addressing these barriers would be a good approach and innovative solutions should be explored. While CCPM as a certifying body, plays an important role, solving these challenges is part of a larger ecosystem, and it's not solely our responsibility.

Supporting immigrant students who face challenges obtaining residencies is an excellent idea. Partnering with groups like CWC under the COMP umbrella could provide fresh ideas and potential solutions.

Last year's decision that ABR-certified physicists cannot take the fellowship exam may present a barrier for Canadians trained in the US who wish to return to work in Canada, particularly in provinces where CCPM certification is tied to salary structures.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (Prepared without Audit)

December 31, 2024

1. ORGANIZATION STATUS

Canadian College of Physicists in Medicine (CCPM) is a not-for-profit organization. The purpose of CCPM is to serve the public by identifying, through certification, individuals who have acquired, demonstrated, and maintained a requisite standard of knowledge, skill and understanding to the clinical practice of medical physics.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. The principal accounting policies of CCPM are summarized as follows:

Revenue Recognition

Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received. Investment income is recognized as revenue when earned. Exam and other fees are recognized on a fiscal basis in the year earned.

Investments

Investments are recorded at fair value. Changes in fair value are included in the statement of operations.

Accounting Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires Management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the dates of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenditures during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (Prepared without Audit)

3. COMMITMENTS

CCPM has contracted for management services for a three year period commencing January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2027 requiring annual base payments of \$17,400 in 2025 plus an annual 2.5% cost of living increase (\$17,860 in 2026 and \$18,320 in 2027). In addition, a variable pricing structure is in place for support for CCPM examinations and recertification. The contract may be terminated by either party on 90 days written notice.

4. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

CCPM's financial instruments consist of cash, accounts receivable, and accounts payable and accrued liabilities. It is Management's opinion that the fair value of these instruments is not materially different than their cost and that CCPM is not exposed to any significant interest rate, currency or credit risk.
